1. MANAGER

A manager oversees and is responsible for resources, tasks, or people.

Although traditionally associated with pastoral care, the term shepherd can also represent stewardship.

Particularly in caring for and guiding others with responsibility and compassion.







12. CARETAKER

Similar to custodian, a caretaker is responsible for the upkeep and preservation of something.

This term emphasises the protective and nurturing aspects of stewardship.









13. CONSERVATOR

A conservator protects and preserves resources, particularly in a way that maintains their value over time.

This term aligns with the aspect of stewardship focused on sustainable and responsible management.









14. GOVERNOR

A governor exercises authority and makes decisions on behalf of another.

In stewardship, it refers to the responsible governance of resources and people entrusted to someone's care.
