Defining Stewardship

The Greek word for "stewardship" is οἰκονομία (oikonomia).

This term comes from two Greek words:
οἶκος (οikos) = "house"/ "household,"
νόμος (nomos) = "management."



Meaning of 'Oikonomia' in the New Testament

Luke 16:1-13 – The Parable of the Unjust Steward

1 Corinthians 4:1-2 - Let a man so consider us, as servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God. Moreover it is required in stewards that one be found faithful.



1. Entrustment

Just as a steward manages their master's property, Christians are entrusted by God to manage what they have.
