Text: Hebrews 2: 5-8 (NKJV)

For He has not put the world to come, of which we speak, in subjection to angels. But one testified in a certain place, saying: "What is man that You are mindful of him, Or the son of man that You take care of him? You have made him a little lower than the angels; You have crowned him with glory and honour and set him over the works of Your hands. You have put all things in subjection under his feet."



Four Lessons

- Honour of People is a God Thought
- Honour is a Position given not taken

Lesson 1: Honour of People is a God Thought

Crowned means that God has encircled us with a crown, like the victor in a contest, He has adorned (beautified, decorated, enhance and garnished) us with honour.

Glory means that God views and estimates us with brightness, dignity, excellence, grace, magnificence, perfection and pre-eminence, as belonging to God.

Honour means that God has put a value on us by the price He paid for us, He showed honour for us by reason of rank and state of office which we hold.



Text: John 5:23 (NKJV)

That all men should honour the Son, even as they honour the Father. He that honoureth not the Son honoureth not the Father which hath sent him.



Lesson 2: Honour is a Position given not taken

- God made us a little lower than the angels
- God seated us in heavenly places in Christ Jesus
- Getting a position will only amplify and expose who we are and what we carry



Text: Matt 27:9 (NKJV)

Then was fulfilled that which was spoken by Jeremiah the prophet, saying, And they took the thirty pieces of silver, the price of him that was valued, whom they of the children of Israel did value



Lesson 3: Honour Provides the Power to Function
